Paul and Silas Tell About Jesus Even When It's Hard Acts 16:6-40

Paul and Silas came to Philippi to tell people about Jesus. Many people listened and started following Jesus. They started a church where people could learn even more about Jesus. Some of the men in Philippi were angry with Paul and Silas. They did not want them teaching the people about Jesus, but Paul and Silas kept right on! The other people in the jail heard them and wondered how they could be singing about Jesus in jail.


