*\*By saving, we mean the student will not have to take some core classes but will instead receive credit for them (see DTS chart). ThM students can save up to 24 hours. MA students can only save up to 16 hours. MACL, MACE, and MACS can only save 15.*

# Course Credits-

Upon completion of the Young Guns program, the seminary student will need to be accepted to the accelerated program at DTS (Requirements: 1. Submit evidence of formal or informal academic education; 2. Complete an objective exam; 3. Submit a composition artifact of academic work; 4. Interview with a member or members of the Advanced Standing Committee; 5. Complete prescribed accelerated courses). *This program is open only to Dallas campus students and must be completed in person.*

Students will then need to satisfactorily complete the accelerated courses to receive the credits for Core Classes.
