But there IS one But we do see Him who was made for a little while lower than
Man crowned as King..the ideal Divine man
"Jesus"...

the angels, *namely*, Jesus, because of His suffering
death crowned with glory and honor, so that by the grace of
God He might taste death for everyone.

and the means of creation ("through Him")
the restoration of man
back to his intended

THIS is what was "fitting":
To have Christ endure
all of man's fall and
live out a perfect
life just like any man

Christ was shown to be perfect at Calvary.
(to perfect the originator of their salvation through
sufferings.)¹¹ For both He who sanctifies and those

who are sanctified are all from one Father; for this reason He is
not ashamed to call them brothers *and sisters*,¹² saying,

all Christians are brothers
of Christ..
as we are all born
through Adam
.. Christ included..

"I WILL PROCLAIM YOUR NAME TO MY BROTHERS,
IN THE MIDST OF THE ASSEMBLY I WILL SING YOUR PRAISE."

I feel this is talking
about Adam...
all humans trace
themselves to one
'father'
(Acts 17:26)

This verse is from Psalm 22
and Applied to Christ...
after dying and rising
he now has brothers..

¹³ And again,

"I WILL PUT MY TRUST IN HIM."

This is used of ISAIAH... He placed his
trust in God...

And again,

"BEHOLD, I AND THE CHILDREN WHOM GOD HAS GIVEN ME."

and as result he "fathered"
other children of faith
who followed him.
